STUDENT & SPOTLIGHT

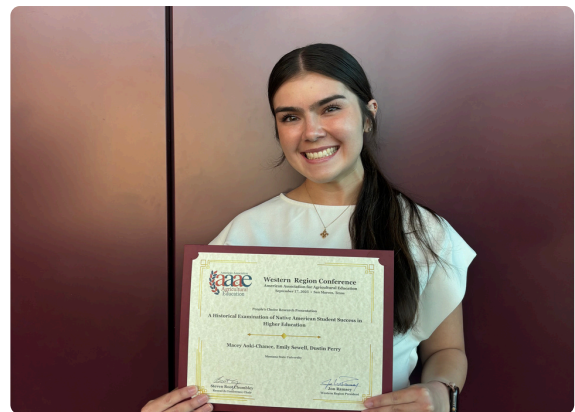

Expanding Montana's Agritourism Industry

Expanding Montana's Agritourism Industry from the Ground Up is an MSU-led project supporting specialty crop producers through the development of the producer-led Montana Agritourism Association. The project funds a part-time Agritourism Specialist to provide business development, education, and networking opportunities that help growers expand agritourism activities and diversify income, particularly for beginning farmers and ranchers.



Agritourism Impact Story



Building on this work, our very own Dr. Shannon Arnold continues to play a central role in advancing agritourism across Montana through leadership, education, and long-term industry development. Dr. Arnold has led multiple grant-funded initiatives as a principal investigator to support producer learning, leadership development, and sustainable agritourism practices statewide. She also helped establish the Montana Agritourism Association and serves as its Treasurer, fostering collaboration and a unified voice for producers. In addition, Dr. Arnold has co-hosted statewide agritourism conferences, developed an undergraduate agritourism course at MSU, and delivers research-based educational programming that equips producers and students alike with the tools to grow agritourism ventures with confidence. Through these efforts, she continues to strengthen connections between education, producers, and rural communities while helping position agritourism as a viable and resilient pathway for Montana agriculture!
