There are a variety of contests available including demonstration/illustrated talk, prepared speech, impromptu speech, career communications, videography, promotional package, commercial, and for the Cloverbuds, reciting the 4-H pledge, doing a demonstration or other talk would be great!

Members who participate fulfill their communications requirement for the end of the year Member Recognition awards, and members ages 13 and up are eligible to compete with their presentation at Montana 4-H Congress in Bozeman in July for state level awards.

Glacier County 4-H Senior Scholarship

Graduating seniors are eligible to apply for the Glacier County 4-H Council scholarship, which has been made possible through generous donations and memorials to the Council. The scholarship seeks to recognize Glacier County 4-H members who have been active in their club and community and set an example of, "Making the Best Better." Up to \$500 will be available, split no more than two ways.

Applications are due by 5 p.m. April 4 to the Glacier County Extension Office and have been e-mailed out to seniors. Applications will be scanned and sent to a third paper for review, please do not include special folders, etc. Applications may be e-mailed as a PDF to kari.lewis@montana.edu or dropped off as a hard copy.

Swine Weighing/Tagging

It's 4-H pig tagging time! Saturday, April 13 is the deadline to tag a pig in for the Marias Fair. Please coordinate with Kari Lewis a time to weigh/tag/deworm your pigs. It is much preferred to tag them while in the trailer versus after they've been let out into a pen.

Members need to have the following information:

- Breed of pig
- Date of birth
- Beginning weight
- Breeder's name and address

Remember, fair weigh-in date is Wednesday, July 17. Fair minimum weight is 220 pounds, maximum payweight is 300 pounds, maximum sale participation weight is 336 pounds. As a generalization, many of the show pig types tend to gain around 1.5 - 2.0 lbs/day while a commerical type pig can be 2.0 - 2.5 lbs/day. Calculate the days until fair from when you purchase your pig to determine what an appropriate beginning start weight would be.

Breeding Projects

Members with breeding projects must submit to Kari Lewis (kari.lewis@montana.edu) by April 13 any of the following forms of identification on any breeding animals they plan to exhibit at fair:

- Bangs tag number
- Scrapie tag number
- Association registration tattoo
- Picture of animal

4-H'ers needs to have full possession of their project animal at this time.

4-H Resources available

Did you know...? The Glacier County 4-H Council has several items available for checkout at no cost to our members. Our 4-H Livestock Genomic Testing project is underway with beef members beginning to collect DNA samples (ear punch) with these Tissue Sampling Units (TSU's). While many tools exist for selection of registered livestock (such as E.P.D.s, etc.), tools for commercial livestock selection are less utilized. Livestock are often visually selected as replacements, but genomic testing can provide predictions to help make profitable selections earlier in the animal's life (which to keep or cull, mating decisions for herd progress, etc.) and can be used in marketing to prove a calf crop's genetics.

Participating members will receive a basic introduction to genomic testing including its purpose and the process. Members will be able to collect and submit a DNA sample from a heifer from their or their family's herd for analysis and receive results back. The test will provide rankings according to 20 economically relevant traits (such as birth weight, growth, maternal, docility, carcass traits, etc.) and 3 economic indexes (Zoetis Cow/Calf, Feedlot/Carcass, and Total Return). The test is backed by over 1.4 million straightbred and crossbred animals. Contact Kari ASAP to participate.

Marias Fair Steer Updates

The maximum steer payweight was increased to 1,650 pounds which would make the maximum sale participation weight 1,848 pounds (effective for 2025 fair). The Montana Steer of Merit requirements have increased the maximum backfat thickness and increased the minimum quality grade from Choice- to Choice, so given those changes and the current industry standards, steer weight was increased. Minimum weight remains 1,100 pounds. Beef members, please make sure to weigh your steers this month if you haven't done so lately. Anyone is welcome to come to Kaleb and Kari Lewis's (194 Rim Road, Kevin) to weigh if needed.

Montana 4-H Foundation Youth Representative Position Open

Are you a Montana 4-H member who wants to gain life and career skills while serving Montana 4-H? We are seeking dedicated and engaged youth applicants to serve on the Montana 4-H Foundation Board of Directors. You must be at least 14 by October 1 of the current 4-H year and be enrolled as a 4-H member the following year. The position is for youth who are enrolled/active 4-H members during their year of service, which will start at the July annual meeting.

What will you give?

You should be able to give your opinion and perspective.

You should be able to share a strong youth voice in our organization.

What will you receive?

An opportunity to "learn by doing" in a youth-adult partnership. Past members have said that serving as a youth on the Montana 4-H Foundation gave them an opportunity to build their confidence, to learn how to work toward common goals as a team, to learn about team dynamics and professionalism. You will gain exposure to non-profit management details and build an understanding that will serve you in your future.

What will you do?

You will be expected to participate in four meetings. The first one will be during Montana 4-H Congress in Bozeman. The other three will be during the school year, with video conference available. Traditionally, the meetings have been during the business day. Your travel and lodging expenses will be covered by the Montana 4-H Foundation. You are responsible to organize your travel.

You will also be expected to serve on at least one committee during your service.

Other Criteria:

- Must be a 4-H member in your home county for at least three consecutive years.
- Must be a current member of a Montana 4-H program (club, county, tribal area) when applying and when serving on the Board.
- Each teen director shall serve a one-year term. July 2025 to July 2026
- Must have the approval of MSU Extension County agent (or approved substitute if position is vacant).
- Those serving as a Montana 4-H State ambassador officer or on the Montana 4-H Council are not eligible to serve simultaneously on the Montana 4-H Foundation Board.




