Deadlines for member and leader enrollments, events, camps, fair, project adds and drops, etc. are set by the Extension Agent, 4-H Committees, and Fair chairmen. **Deadlines will be adhered to** in order to facilitate event planning, to meet state deadlines, for funding documentation, and multi-county committee meetings, etc. **PLANNING COMMITTEES OFTEN MEET THE DAY AFTER THE DEADLINE**. **Payment and scholarship requests (if applicable) are also due by the deadline unless other arrangements have been made with Roni prior. LACK OF PAYMENT BY THE DEADLINE, MAY RESULT IN THE REGISTRATION/ENTRY NOT BEING ACCEPTED**.

Additionally, if you send items via the fax, it is <u>your</u> responsibility to check with the office to confirm our receipt. We will not call, text, or email you. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

CLUB YEAR-END FINANCIAL SUMMARY REPORTS DUE

Club Organizational Leaders received a copy of the annual Year-End Financial Summary Report. The report provides an open, public record of each club's finances and fulfills state and federal audit requirements. Reports are due October 31. Clubs will not be able to receive project books until the Reports are completed. With the IRS ruling governing 4-H funds it is imperative we have this report so your club can retain a checking account. Failure to meet the deadline may result in the loss of your club's charter and/or the closing of your club financial account(s).

ENROLL ONLINE USING ZSUITE BY NOVEMBER 15

In order to keep mailing out newsletters and emails to the appropriate audience, we need club re-enrollments completed online by November 15. Reenrollment instructions should have been passed out to each family at the club's October meeting. Instructions can be found on the Yellowstone County 4-H website on the How to Join 4-H page.

This year all members and leaders will enroll themselves through the ZSuite program. Instructions for enrollment can be found on the state-4-H website at https://www.montana.edu/extension/4h/resources/4henrollment/index.html. ARE YOU CHANGING CLUBS THIS YEAR? PAPERWORK IS REQUIRED.

Families changing clubs this year are REQUIRED TO COMPLETE the Changing 4-H Clubs Form that can be found and printed off the County 4-H website under "How to Enroll" at

https://www.montana.edu/extension/yellowstone/4h/Enrollment.html. It is the family's responsibility to have the form completed, signed off by the Organizational Leader of the club you are departing and the Organizational Leader of the club you are joining. It is the FAMILY's RESPONSIBILITY to provide a copy of the completed form to the Extension Office.

Your family will not be in active status until the Extension Office has received the Changing 4-H Clubs Form.

SELF DETERMINED PROJECT ARE NOW DESIGN YOUR OWN PROJECT

Design You Own project offers an opportunity to develop and carry out a project of individual design. This means selecting a topic, deciding goals, obtaining resources and designing records. The member is responsible for developing the project with advice or direction of an adult. This project can cover any subject and may be related to any current 4-H project. Examples include ceramics, bookkeeping, and outdoor cooking. Design a project of special interest to you, as the success depends on your initiative. Those who select a worthwhile topic and become intrigued often do some of the best and most rewarding work. Members must complete a project outline to the Extension Office by March 1.

4-H MISSION & ADHERANCE TO DEADLINES

The goal of the 4-H program is to provide youth development and mentoring to school age children. The program focuses on teaching youth life skills that they will continue to use in their careers and adult lives.

Some important parts of those skills are responsibility, punctuality, preparedness, and the consequences of not meeting deadlines.

For most 4-H events and activities there are deadlines that should be adhered to. Deadlines apply to leaders and members including enrollment forms, club information, add/drops, fair and registration deadlines for various events (camps, workshops, scholarships, showcase, etc. etc.) Besides meeting deadlines members and leaders should be prepared when attending meetings and events.

Due dates and deadlines are always printed on related forms. They are in newsletter articles and on the calendar. Registration and entry forms can be found on our <u>county 4-H website</u> at https://www.montana.edu/extension/yellowstone/4h/index.html or in the monthly 4-H newsletters. Completed forms can be sent to us in whichever way members, parents and leaders find most convenient including fax, scan & e-mail, postal delivery or bringing them in to the office. Our office hours are 8am-5pm Monday through Friday and there <u>is</u> someone there over the lunch hour. Whichever method you choose, it is YOUR responsibility to confirm that we have received items.

We realize that we have some very young members who may not be able to keep track of this information on their own. Leaders and parents should provide an example to these children by helping them to stick to deadlines and be prepared for events they are participating in and teaching them the importance of both.

SHOOTING SPORTS MEMBERS SIGN UP NOW IN ZSUITE

4-H members should get signed up soon after ZSuite enrollment opened on October 1, in order to participate in the 2023-2024 4-H year shooting sports weekly workshops which start in November. Weekly archery, air pistol, and BB gun workshops teach progressive learning, so it is vital to start on time. If you are not enrolled and approved in the project in ZSuite, you cannot attend the workshops. No exceptions.

All 4-H Shooting sports curriculum is only to be used by a 4-H member enrolled in a County Shooting Sport programs lead by a 4-H certified Shooting Sports leader. No Shooting Sports projects that involve firearms, airguns, or archery equipment may be taken independently without a certified leader.

To enroll in 4-H shooting sports, youth must be 9 years old on October 1 of the 2023-2024 year. The only exception is the BB Safety course which is open to those turning 8 years old by October 1 of the 2023-2024 year, and the Western Heritage Project requirements.
